Bronx Garage Collapse by Battalion Chief

n May 3, 2000, a verbal alarm was received in the quarters of Engine 92/Ladder 44 and Battalion 17 for a collapse on Findlay Avenue, a few short blocks away. When units arrived, they found a one-story garage had collapsed, trapping two victims. Upon his arrival, Battalion Chief Lever of the 17th Battalion transmitted a 10-60 signal.

Ladder 44 located a victim on the exposure #2 side in the rear of the garage. Members immediately began the process of extricating him and, in a short period of time, successfully removed him from the collapse area.


The victim stated that one other worker still was in the garage. Initially, there had been four workers in the building prior to the collapse. The two in the front of the garage escaped unharmed.

The worker removed by Ladder 44 received injuries to his leg and was taken to a local hospital. The other trapped worker was crushed under the heavy roof of the garage. Rescue 3 was able to shore up and stabilize the roof and remove the worker. All of the workers were in the process of cleaning out the garage when the roof collapsed.
